



GOLDEN JUBILEE 2023 — 50 YEARS OF FAITH

Congratulations Saint Christopher's Cathedral — A Golden Jubilee!

On February 5, 1973, the Church of Saint Christopher became the Cathedral and the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn. On February 5^{th} 2023 we mark our 50^{th} Anniversary.

The story of our humble yet glorious Cathedral however, begins much earlier. On a warm 27th of February 1928, the Parish School of Saint Christopher's was established, with Father Patrick Haydon appointed the first parish priest. Over the following decade the school would serve also as the church and community hall, for Canberra's growing Catholic Community.

Until in 1938, when Saint Christopher's church was built and the following year officially opened by Archbishop John Panico, Apostolic Delegate (June 4).

Canberra, means 'meeting place', in the Ngunnawal language; and was so named because as the growing Capital, it was somewhere that many travellers would come. Placing the new Church and parish community of Canberra, under the patronage of Saint Christopher, the patron saint of travellers, seemed a suitable and even propertic choice.

On February 5th 1948, when the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn was formally established, the parish church of Saint Christopher, with her location, size and beauty, proved appropriate for the new Mother Church of the people of Canberra and Goulburn.

Saint Christopher's was extended and on the Silver Jubilee of the Archdiocese (1973),

Archbishop Thomas Cahill consecrated the extensions and St Christopher's became the Cathedral of the Archdiocese. On this day, the Archbishop anointed the walls where the marble crosses and candles now stand – and burn brightly on June 4th each year – setting this building aside as holy, where the living stones who gathering within, come to worship and give glory to God (1 Peter 2:4-6).

On Sunday, February 5, we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Cathedral's dedication. We celebrate *this* anniversary with particular joy and thanksgiving. For this Cathedral has long been the physical representation of the community of faith which regularly gathers within and the place where the Mysteries of our faith take place.

St Christopher's is the Eucharistic heart and the steadfast sign of the unity of our Local Church of Canberra and Goulburn. Observing the dedication celebrates the mystery and magnificence of the *living* Church; the people of God in pilgrimage to the new Jerusalem.

We pray for all who have gathered over the last 50 years (and more), to worship within the walls of this parish Church and Cathedral. In moments of great sorrow and fear, as well as immense joy and awe. May every pilgrim who visits this place, go forth having experienced the gentle presence and the merciful Heart of the God who walks among us. And may we continue to invoke the intercession and protection of Saint Christopher as we continue along the pilgrim way.

"On the 5th of February, 1973, as a seminarian, I was present to witness Archbishop Thomas Cahill consecrate St Christopher's Cathedral. Never then did I imagine then, that I would be appointed Administrator under Archbishop Francis Carroll. ... As Administrator (1984-1988), I came to know the parishioners quite well. They were supportive and faith-filled people. ...

A few changes occurred during my time. Through the generosity of parishioners we acquired a new Carrara marble altar for the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, a scaled down version of the high altar in the Annunciation Basilica, Nazareth; three beautiful icons executed by an Egyptian Benedictine nun, Sr. M. Paul, in their

Convent on the Mount of Olives, Jerusalem; and two great bells from the Netherlands and a marble rail for the Shrine of Our Lady Help of

Christians from the Sacred Heart Church, Mosman, Sydney. ...


My bond, too, with our Spanish Romanesque Cathedral is very strong. Together with Fr Bernard Patterson we were ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop Thomas Cahill in 1977. Even though St. Christopher's was never intended to be the Cathedral it has been made so by the extensions of Archbishop Cahill and its consecration in 1973.

Praised be Jesus Christ.


Mons. Patrick Maurice Haydon P.P Parish Priest of Canberra from 27.02.1928—1949


"In 1973 I was a second-year seminarian at St Columba's College, Springwood. Archdiocesan seminarians assisted in the liturgy of consecration. I had lived nearby in Fitzroy Street, attended the then St Christopher's School and later St Edmund's College, been an altar server and a member of the 2nd Manuka Scouts under the leadership of Fr Kevin Barry-Cotter, the then Administrator of the parish.

The most noticeable difference was in the size of the extended and refurbished St Christopher's. I sensed that the occasion marked the change from what I had seen as a big parish church to one with significance well beyond those known to me. The presence of many bishops, the Governor-General and the Prime Minister confirmed this."

Entrance Antiphon: O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God **Responsorial:** A light rises in the darkness for the upright

Gospel Acclamation: I am the light of the world, say the Lord; the man who follows me will have the light of life. **Communion Antiphon:** Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

First Reading Is 58: 7-10

Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shone like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over. Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call and he will say, 'I am here.' if you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

Second Reading 1 Cor 2:1-5

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

Gospel Mt 5:13-16

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men. 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'
