A HAPPY AND BLESSED MOTHER'S DAY TO ALL MOTHERS

Happy Mother's Day! We pray today in thanksgiving for all mothers; those with us, those who have died, and of course mothers to be. We give thanks for the sacrifice and love we have known in our own lives from our mothers; but too our wives, sisters, friends, and all women who echo the tenderness, wisdom, presence, and beauty of the God who becomes incarnate and walks this journey with us. Through their lives we see proof that God never loves from a distance.

The beauty of motherhood which we celebrate is, above all, a living image of the God who promises and gives life; who weaves his very life into the fabric of human existence. Indeed as St. Thérèse of Lisieux wrote, "the loveliest masterpiece of the heart of God is the heart of a mother." People often ask, why, why a priest? And I can only honestly answer: because of a mother, a sister, a friend; because of the beauty, witness, fidelity, and alluring wisdom I saw (and still see) in women close to me. If a woman, a mother, a wife, a friend, a sister can love that much, be that comforting, that beautiful, that wise, how much more must our God be all of these?... and more. When I see mothers with their children, and the wives of my close friends; when I see my sister's family growing and my close mates marrying and having beautiful children; I can not help but think what a revelation of God's love we have in motherhood. That is the honest answer. There is nothing more beautiful nor convincing to me of God's love. The beauty and life I see every day draws me to know the God I now live for and serve in my own vocation. Where would I be, where would any of us be, without the gift of motherhood; without the incredibly powerful and alluring witness of genuine femininity?

We pray this day that our society and world might honour the dignity and vocation of motherhood. Not degrading, discouraging or even trying to redefine it, but recognising it as the foundation it truly is - as the greatest vocation and gift of God's love the world could know. We recall the great mystery of the God who chose to place Himself, tiny and helplessly dependent, into the protective womb, loving arms and gentle hands of a human mother. From Mary, God took human flesh, all because of her faith-filled yes. Is there any greater vocation? Thank God for the gift of motherhood, which is truly a witness and participation in God's creative, nurturing love.

Friends, today we pray for all mothers, including those whose lives are marred by struggle, disappointment, and violence. May they be relieved of these burdens, know their dignity, and the closeness of their God. For mothers who have lost children, that you may find consolation in God's promise of life, the support of those around you, and the genuine promise of being united with your child once again. We pray too for mothers to be and of course for all those who experience the agonising pain of infertility and difficulty in conceiving.

May is traditionally dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, the Mother of God, and our own spiritual mother. Mary was chosen above all women; her faith and obedience to God's free invitation and grace granted the way to the Incarnation and our life with God. Her example teaches us faith, obedience, humility and, most of all, how to truly respond to love by responding to the call of Love Himself. It's fitting then that we begin May with the celebration of Mother's Day, this vocation beyond compare. For a mother is a co-creator in a particular way - bringing life into the world with God. Thank you to all mothers. A Happy and Blessed Mother's Day.

Readings of the Day – 6th Sunday of Easter —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia. **Responsorial Psalm:** The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them.

Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: If you love me, keep my commandments, says the Lord, and I will ask the Father and he will send you another Paraclete, to abide with you for ever, alleluia.

First Reading Acts 10:25-26. 34-35. 44-48

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!' Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.' While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.

Second Reading 1 Jn 4:7-10

My dear people, let us love one another since love comes from God and everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Anyone who fails to love can never have known God, because God is love. God's love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only Son so that we could have life through him; this is the love I mean: not our love for God, but God's love for us when he sent his Son to be the sacrifice that takes our sins away.

Gospel Reading Jn 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if you do what I command you, I shall not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me, no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask him in my name. What I command you is to love one another.'
