LAUDATO SI' WEEK, 22nd-29th May, 2022

Sunday May 22nd begins *Laudato Si' Week*, and marks the 7th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical on care for creation. This celebration unites us to listen and respond to God's first act of revelation in the gift of creation, to rejoice in the progress made, as well renew our efforts through the *Laudato Si'* Action Platform, walking the "Synodal" path. Our 11am Mass will celebrate this occasion and the Archdiocese's commitment to implement the seven goals of *Laudato Si'*.

Friends,

This past week, the clergy gathered at Saint Clement's in Galong, for the annual Clergy Assembly. This is always a much anticipated occasion; not just for ongoing professional development but on account of the time it affords us to be together as a presbyterate. One of the greatest gifts of the priesthood I have found, is priestly fraternity. A guest presenter for the assembly, Teresa Pirola, wrote to me at the assembly's conclusion: "The collective spirit of the men was really impressive - it struck me almost immediately as the day unfolded. A great example of the 'synodality' that is much talked about these days."

As well as looking at administrative matters and practice, we were grateful to a number of presenters who also joined us this year, one of course being Teresa; a passionately gifted educator in Catholic Faith Formation. A true Catechist, Teresa led us in a renewed reflection on the Sacrament of Baptism, the first sacrament and 'gateway' to life in God. What was particularly helpful however was Teresa's way of drawing the tangible connections between the baptism ritual and the rhythms of life and faith in the families of the baptised. Teresa spoke of the role of the community in Christian initiation, and infant baptism as a source of life for the whole parish. I sat there genuinely renewed and inspired by her insights, and I hope to explore these with the parish more deeply. What a gift we have in Baptism! Yet how seldom we reflect upon it. One question asked was: Do you know the date of your own baptism? Perhaps a good question we can all ask ourselves.

We also heard from our Archdiocesan Chancellor, Patrick McArdle on Synodality, and our Young Adults team on significant young adult and catechesis progress in the Archdiocese. Both extraordinarily encouraging!

This time was also one of celebration, to recognise those marking significant anniversaries of Priestly ministry in 2022. Our Jubilarians this year are:

Celebrating 25 years: Fr. Mark Croker (28 February 1997) & Fr. Paul McGavin (2 May 1997). And celebrating 50 years Fr. Greg Beath (25 August 1972), Fr. Mick Burke (26 August 1972) & Fr. Bernie Hennessy (8 September 1972).

We congratulate and thank these men for their fidelity and ministry to us all over many years. I personally reflected upon what their daily 'yes' has given me over my lifetime, and continues to give me now. Jesus' forgiveness in Reconciliation, his Body and Blood in the Eucharist, and even more striking Fr Mick Burke, who gave me eternal life when he baptised me, all those years ago in Holy Family Church, Gowrie!

Continue to pray for your priests- past, present and future... they do love you, indeed they are priests for you alone... of this I have never been more convinced. FT

First Reading

Acts 15:1-2. 22-29

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders. Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them: 'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

Second Reading

Rv 21:10-14, 22-23

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb. I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it. Jn 14:24-29

Gospel

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him. Those who do not love me do not keep me words. And my word is not my own: it is the word of the one who sent me. I have said these thing to you while still with you: but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you. Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away, and shall return. If you loved me you would have been glad to know that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you this now before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.'
