

Eye for an Eye, Tooth for a Tooth

Jesus' words scandalised many who heard them. His teaching was radical, shocking even. Yet perhaps not for reasons first thought. Jesus repeats, more than once: 'You have heard it said... but I say to you...!"

Where however had they heard it said? The Torah (also called the Pentateuch). The highest authority. Nothing less than God's enshrined Teaching, now given to His people! No wonder the Pharisees (and others) were out to destroy Jesus! How offensive! Who could speak in such a way? Who, but the *One* Who Himself is the Eternal Word; the Author of the Torah – the Law now Incarnate.

Yet it's not scandal that Jesus seeks to bring. But rather, depth and life. He neither abrogates nor destroys the law. He comes to *intensify* it. Jesus now places flesh on the bones, so to speak. An identity is now given, not written on stone, but upon the human heart!

And why? Because the human person is God's living Image! Not what we do (or don't do), but who we are. You are made for more. As we hear this morning: "You belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to God" (1 Cor 3:23)

The Law is enshrined not on any superficial level (as in Pharisaic minds), but now within the human heart. Jesus evokes then: 'be perfect, as your Heavenly Father is perfect!'

Jesus reveals that the human person is not created for mediocrity. Yet so many settle for just that. How often have we heard, with a nervous laugh: "Well I haven't committed adultery! I haven't killed anyone this week!" When the Christian adopts this attitude, not only do they miss the point, they fail to fulfil the law. And slowly, in apathy, they become less and less like God. Indeed, quickly they become their own god; determining even life and its value. Soon, even euthanasia is couched in a wayward human mind, as 'merciful'.

Jesus says: "You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. ... 'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..." These teachings are radical. Jesus is calling us to not simply keep the Commandments, but to go beyond them. Of course, do not kill... but go further still, give life! Love your enemies, pray for them, and forgive them....

Now we begin to see how radical Christianity is, when truly lived. In a Word, Jesus commands,

become like your God... more and more in His Likeness, the Image which you already bear.

First Reading Lv 19:1-2. 17-18

The Lord spoke to Moses; he said: 'Speak to the whole community of the sons of Israel and say to them: "Be Holy, for I, the Lord you God, am holy. "You must not bear hatred for your brother in your heart. You must openly tell him, your neighbour, of his offence; this way you will not take a sin upon yourself. You must not exact vengeance, nor must you bear a grudge against the children of your people. You must love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord.""

Second Reading 1 Cor 3:16-23

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple. Make no mistake about it: if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? Because the wisdom of this world is foolishness to God. As scripture says: the Lord knows wise men's thoughts: he knows how useless they are, or again: God is not convinced by the arguments of the wise. So there is nothing to boast about in anything human: Paul, Apollos, Cephas, the world, life and death, the present and the future, are all you servants; but you belong to Christ and Christ belongs to God.

Gospel Mt 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away. 'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'
