Dear friends,

During November, our Catholic faith calls us to reflect upon *Christ's Body* in a particularly beautiful way. What is it to be a part of this Body? What does our baptism do? On November 1st we celebrate *All Saints Day*, a day on which we invoked those who now gaze upon the face of God (what is often called the 'Church Triumphant'). On *All Souls Day* (November 2nd) we pray for the faithful departed and those in purgatory (the 'Church Penitent'); and of course we also call to mind all of us, who remain here, as those who continue on the pilgrim journey (known aptly as the 'Church Militant') (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 954-62). When we consider these parts as a whole, we contemplate *the full, complete Body* of Christ; what Saint Augustine once called the *totus Christus* (the whole Christ).

What this means, is that we are *never* separated from those we love. Jesus' Body, God's Body draws us together in One, regardless of time or place. The One Sacrament which makes this a reality is the Eucharist.

We pray then with and for the whole Body of Christ throughout November, especially for all those who have died; family, friends, and those with no one to pray for them. As Christians, we don't travel through this world alone. Our salvation is wrapped up with the salvation of others, and charity beckons us to come to their aid. We must pray for the dead always, but especially in this Month of Holy Souls, let us devote some time each day, that they might remember us before the throne of God when we are most in need of prayers. Let us remember them, in the way the 'Church Triumphant' remembers and assists us. This is the Body, fully alive!

With Monday November 2nd marking the feast of *All Souls*, we are also acutely aware of the pain felt by those left behind; especially when they are our children who have gone before us. United in prayer, a **twilight Mass for all those who have lost babies and children** will be offered on **Friday the 13th of November, 7pm, in Saint Peter Chanel's** Church, Yarralumla. Those who have lost children of all ages are warmly invited to record their child's name on cards available in our church foyers (alternatively please let the office know and a card can be made up for you). On the evening you are invited to light a candle to be placed before the altar.

In our times of grief, let us forever be consoled by Christ who when asked "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" lovingly responded:

"Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever becomes humble like [a] child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes such a child in My name welcomes Me" (Matt 18:1, 3-5).

Eternal Rest grant to all Your departed, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

Amen.

The App is free, download onto your smartphone and register, then, simply scan the QR code located in the church entrance each time you enter! All data is secure, it saves time and you won't have to touch a pen! Please note this will only be in used during weekdays. WEEKEND MASSES MUST REMAIN MANUAL SIGNING IN - to ensure numbers are not exceeded.

NEW PROTOCOLS - Please familiarize yourself with current guidelines

- •In accordance with government restrictions, only 139 people are permitted in the church at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.
- •ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are renewed daily & destroyed after 28 days.
- •All attendees (including children) must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- •Communion is to be received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood.
- •Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 4sqm p/p rule.
- •Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. NB: Families can sit together.
- •Please use the hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided at entrances.
- •There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- •No collection plates to be passed around, but money/envelopes placed at collection points.
- •Please DO NOT return your bulletin to the basket, if you are not taking it home put it in the bin.

Readings of the Day - All Saints —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Let us all rejoice in the Lord, as we celebrate the feast day in honour of all the Saints, at whose festival the Angels rejoice and praise the Son of God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Come to me, all you that labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest, says the Lord. Alleluia!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Blessed are the clean of heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God. Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

First Reading Rv 7:2-4. 9-14

I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty was to devastate land and sea, 'Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.' Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel.

After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words, 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.'

One of the elders then spoke, and asked me, 'Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?' I answered him, 'You can tell me, my Lord.' Then he said, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb.'

Second Reading 1 Jn 3:1-3

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is. Surely everyone who entertains this hope must purify himself, must try to be as pure as Christ.

Gospel Reading Mt 5:1-12

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them: 'How happy are the poor in spirit: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God. Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'
