ASCENSION AND CARE FOR CREATION

At first glance, it might not seem that these two themes are necessarily connected. The Ascension of Jesus is a matter of heaven: Jesus returns to his Father, he takes his place at his right hand interceding for the Church, the apostles are told by angels that Christ will return to us in the same way as he left us. It is the end of an era, Jesus is still with us but not as he was before. The Church celebrates Jesus' guidance, his intercession and perhaps most importantly we long for our going to him and his return to us.

On a day focused upon heaven, why bring forward matters of the earth? It is telling, that the angel asks the apostles why they are looking into the sky, implying that they should be doing something else. Our hope is in heaven, but our responsibilities are here on earth. God calls us to action here and now, so that we might win our place in heaven. For a Christian the world should not take first place in our heart, but it should be appropriately valued. The earth is our heritage, the Bible teaches us that we were created from it, it is the place where we encountered God, and it is the place where future generations will come to know God. For a Catholic we must care for our Earth the same way that we care for and support our churches.

We do this, not out of the hope of restoring a lost paradise but out of the hope of providing a place of encounter with God.

On this Sunday of the Ascension let us pray for our world, that when Jesus returns to us He will find our care for each other and our common home pleasing.

Ascension of the Lord —Year A — 20/21 May



Entrance Antiphon: Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia

Responsorial: God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord Gospel Acclamation: Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world Communion Antiphon: Behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age, alleluia

First Reading

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Second Reading

Eph 1:17-23 May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commandments I gave to you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'
