

SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

Dear parishioners and visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish.

We now enter the last week of Ordinary Time, with next Sunday marking a new liturgical year and the season of **Hope** with the beginning Advent and our preparation for the Birth of Christ, the *Light* and *Hope* of the world (John 8:12). On this last Sunday however, each year, the Church observes the **Feast of Christ the King**. This Solemnity has always inhabited the hearts of the faithful, but at the same time, it is one which in a sense remains relatively new. Formally promulgated in 1925 by Pius XI, the feast emerged as a *great reminder* to a world and people in a time of unprecedented turbulence and chaos. After 4 years, 3 months and 7 days, the 'Great War' had ended, but now its horrific, far-reaching repercussions were in full swing. Confusion and anxiety was all around. Hostilities between countries remained, economies crumbled, and the onslaught of the Great Depression was poised to put the morale of mankind at an all-time low. People were suffering in unprecedented ways and they searched (perhaps some without even knowing in their hearts) for an answer, a leader, in a word... a king.

Jesus has always been known as King (cf. John 18:37ff), however, in the first part of the 20th century the Church saw this knowledge of and reverence for this true Kingship waning, forgotten amid the confusion and fighting of earthly empires and empty kingships. Might we say the same today, albeit in a different, yet also eerie similar atmosphere of anxiety and frustration?

The Holy Father saw many, including many faithful, grasping at the straws of false hopes and empty promises offered by regimes, movements and self-proclaimed 'kings'. Many grew weak in faith, the Church and Her spiritual and moral teachings made out to be archaic, irrelevant, and burdensome. Dictatorships abounded in Europe and beyond, while secularisation grew. Yet amidst this loud cacophony of hopelessness and confusion, the innate human search for identity, *Hope*... and an answer, grew stronger.

How much this beautiful feast has to say and remind us of especially today, in this 2020 year of strife and struggle, of isolation and distress! Jesus is placed back at the centre and on the throne of the human heart. Jesus reaffirms many -then and now- of the only *lasting Kingship* which *actually delivers what it promises*.

The worldly notion of a king is one who stands far off and acts through his armies from the safe, glorious heights of his castle... but not our King! Jesus is the King who comes and suffers *with* his people. He enters the mess, scandal, and pandemic of our lives! He is not only *on* the front line, He *is* the front line; coming so close to our humanity by freely revealing Himself in the silence of a manger and in the vulnerable depths of the human heart. This is the King who breaks all preconceived ideas of what or who a king is and how he is expected to act. This is our King, and this day we turn our hearts and lives to Him, that our Hope may be fulfilled as the Prince of Peace and Love, *alone*, reigns in our hearts.

Let us take heart after a year of great struggle, and as one Body let us continue to make the journey, with Our King, together.

PRESENT PROTOCOLS - Please be familiar with current guidelines

- In accordance with government restrictions, only 139 people are permitted in the Cathedral at any one time. Entry to Mass will be through one door.
- ALL PARISHIONERS & VISITORS MUST sign in upon entry. Records are securely stored and destroyed after 28 days.
- All attendees (including children) must complete the Mass Register prior to entry.
- Communion is received in the hand only & not under the species of the Precious Blood.
- Physical distancing rules still apply—respecting the 4sqm p/p rule.
- Please sit where there is a 'Please sit here' marker. Every 2nd pew is closed. *NB:* Families can sit together.
- Please use hand sanitiser upon entry and clean your pew/space with the wipes provided.
- There will be no physical contact at the sign of peace.
- No collection plates are in use, but money/envelopes can be deposited at collection points.
- Please DO NOT return your bulletin to the basket, but keep or dispose of appropriately. **Please maintain social distancing 1.5m, at all times, including in the single line formed to receive Holy Communion.** Blue squares and yellow markers on the tiles indicate these distances. Thank you for your commitment in keeping everyone safe.





Readings of the Day – Feast of Christ the King in Ordinary Time —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: *How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour. To Him belong glory and power forever*

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.*

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: *Alleluia, alleluia! Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father, David! Alleluia!*

First Reading

Ez 34:11-12. 15-17

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them. As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats.

Second Reading

1 Cor 15:20-26. 28

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel Reading

Mt 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'
