The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

A captain of a football team is being interviewed on live TV by sports reporters. He has let his star striker sit out a semi final match. The captain is explaining to the reporters that the player's wife is expecting their first child that day. One particularly insistent reporter tries to ask why the captain would let this happen during such an important match. The Captain looked at the reporter and addressed him personally,

"Son, you aren't a parent are you? When you welcome a child into this world and hold him in your hands, you'll understand what is really important in this life."

I can't for the life of me remember who this captain was, who the star player was or even which team they played for, but seeing this interview on TV struck a chord deep within me.

I was in the seminary and slowly making peace with spiritual fatherhood. The image of holding my child in my hands was something deeply moving, as this captain had said, we will know what is really important.

But what I thought, about holding in my hands someone else's child? Every time we come to communion we hold within our hands the Son of God. So precious, so small, so vulnerable. God who created the entire universe has made himself one of us, and made bread and wine into his body and blood.

When we take him into our hands, we hold the body that died for us on the cross, that rose for us again. Not a lifeless body, but the body which rose. We hold within our hands the living author of life, we hold our hope, our salvation, our love. Let us pray that on this feast, we will know what is truly important in life.

First Reading Dt 8:2-3. 14-16

Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord. 'Do not then forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known.'

Second Reading 1 Cor 10:16-17

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

Gospel Jn 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jews: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone eats this bread will live for ever.'
