Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

On the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ), we ask, what is the Eucharist? We know it is not just a sign or symbol, nor simply a 'reminder', as some are quick to think. If it is then it is empty, literally. Rather, the Eucharist is the actual Body and Blood of Jesus. The Body and Blood of God. The words of the priest at each Mass – in the person of Jesus – bring to bear the same effects of Christ's words at the Last Supper, here and now.

How fitting that we celebrate Pope Francis' recent announcement of Blessed Carlo Acutis' approaching Canonisation in Rome. Blessed Carlo Acutis is an Italian teenager who died of cancer in 2006 at 15, and is known for his great devotion to the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

At the Last Supper Jesus spoke words which now echo over every altar around the world: "This is my Body, given for you." Followed by words no less strange: "This is my blood, the blood of the Covenant, poured out for you and for all..."

This Blood that we drink and Body which we eat, manifests the greatest bond between creature and Creator. Only by seeing this, can we see that the Eucharist is not just some 'optional extra'; or some incidental to the Christian life. The Eucharist is our Identity and indeed only reason for being Catholics. It is the relationship of the God who comes close.

When this fact of the Real Presence isn't grasped (as much as it can be), no wonder people fall away from the church and become lukewarm in faith, I would too!

We can't just live on a memory and an example. Memories and examples are never enough for the human heart. Some claim all they need are the Scriptures, failing to realise that these very pages came from a community gathered to celebrate the Eucharist.

At the Table of the Eucharist we encounter a God who loves so much, that He deigns to feed us with His own flesh; a flesh so agonizingly suffered in and given up, that we might have real Life and not remain distant from the God we crave so much.

In the Garden, Adam and Eve tried to snatch Life for themselves. But in the Eucharist, God offers life as a gift – something which can never be stolen nor substituted.

Today, we can sadly hear – even from Christians – the popular slogan: 'I'm spiritual, not religious.' But what does that even mean!? Perhaps those who say it don't even know! I don't need the Church? Her ritual, Her Sacraments? What it means is: I don't need the Son of God. His memory and model is enough. "I don't need the Eucharist..." I don't need to eat His flesh, nor drink His blood.

Blessed Carlo's mother recalls him once remarking: 'There are queues in front of a concert, in front of a football game, but I don't see these gueues in front of the Blessed Sacrament!'

Our relationship with God is not merely spiritual. It's physical too. Which is the greatest truth of all. God desires an intimate, physical, Life Giving covenant between the human and the divine.

On the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, God nourishes and reminds us not only of his extraordinary love, but of how close that love has and will come.

As you receive Jesus today, into your body, pause... and be not afraid to be truly astounded; to truly believe! You hold in your hands the God who made everything, and as a mother feeds her child, so with his own Body and Blood, God feeds you.

Suffice to say, Jesus promised His disciples He would be with them always, even to the end of the age (Matt 28:20). In the Eucharist, Jesus fulfils this Promise, not symbolically, but literally. In this Sacrament God lays Himself at your feet, vulnerable, at the door of the human Heart. How astoundingly blessed and unworthy we are.

Wishing you a Blessed Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Corpus Christi — Year B — 1/2 June



Entrance Antiphon: He fed them with the finest wheat.

Responsorial: I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will

live for ever Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, says the Lord.

First Reading Ex 24:3-8

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

Second Reading Heb 9:11-15

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God. He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Gospel Matthew 28:16-20

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover. And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.
