WISHING YOU A BLESSED FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

A Faithful Servant (1927–2022)

With sadness, yet abounding thanksgiving, we farewell and pray for the soul of Pope Benedict XVI. Born April 16, 1927, in Bavaria, Germany, Joseph Ratzinger knew what darkness looked like. Yet no only did the young Joseph not give up on the light of Truth – his life became a witness to, and humble servant of that Truth, the Light of the World – Jesus Christ.

In his own personal life, through his teaching, and as priest, bishop and pope, Benedict's desire was that Christ took centre-stage. Like St. Peter, he would stumble along the path of his Master, but always with eyes fixed faithfully upon the one who first called him.

Growing up, his gaze was drawn through works of men like Romano Guardini and Theodor Haecker; both of whom had intellectually opposed the evils of the Third Reich. Figures such as these stood for truth against ideology; something Benedict own life would constantly seek, in the most humble, honest and intellectually rigorous of ways. He would coin the term, and often speak against the 'dictatorship of relativism', the cause of anxiety in so many a human heart.

Benedict XVI was a shepherd, able to speak with clarity, the truths Jesus had entrusted to his Church, in turbulent times for both the church and the world. Cardinal Joachim Meisner later described him, as a man with "the intelligence of 12 professors" and yet one "as pious as a child on the day of his First Communion."

Benedict XVI undoubtedly leaves behind a rich legacy as a Pope and theologian, but more powerfully too, he leaves the witness of a gentleness and humility emulative of his Lord.

One evening, during a Prayer Vigil at World Youth Day in Madrid, 2011, dark clouds began to gather. As Pope Benedict XVI began his address, a fierce burst of rain and wind howled in. The lighting flashed and the sound system cut out, even tents flew into the air. The Pope was urged to leave the crowd and take shelter. But he gentle declined the invitation, and patiently remained on the open stage, covered only by an umbrella, struggling in the wind. Seeing the Pope's stand firm, those gathered, kept their eyes upon him... and remained too. After the storm passed, a great and wholly unexpected calm took over. The Pope finished speaking and exposed the Blessed Sacrament. He knelt in silence before Jesus, with the crowd gathered behind him, as if to remind them, "See, Jesus has been with us, this whole time, even as the storm raged around us".

Such an experience spoke of who this man was, and captures his life, his unwavering dedication and trust in Christ, the Gospel, and the Church.

May he rest in peace and rise in Glory.

The Feast of the Epiphany — Chalking the Doors

The traditional markings of "CMB" refer to the names of the three Wise Men who visited the Holy Family at the Nativity: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar who gave the infant Jesus gold, frankincense and myrrh. "CMB" is also an abbreviation of the Latin Christus mansionem benedicat - "May Christ bless this home."

The numbers preceding and following symbolize the year, with crosses in between. Here is a shorter order of blessing you can do at home:

Leader: Peace be to this house.

All: And to all who dwell herein.

Leader: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial. All: Our Father.

Leader: Bless, O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The lintel of the front doors is marked with the blessed chalk: 20 + C + M + B + 20

We pray: God of mercy, fill our home with the light and love of Christ that it may be place of hospitality and welcome. May Christ be our shelter when we are at home, our companion when we are away, and our welcome guest when we return. Through Christ our Lord.

Let us bless the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Epiphany of the Lord –Year A — 7/8 January



Entrance Antiphon: Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kingship is in his grasp, and power and dominion.

Responsorial: Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.

Gospel Acclamation: We have seen his star in the East; and have come to adore the Lord.

Communion Antiphon: We have seen his star in the East, and have come with gifts to adore the Lord.

First Reading Is 60:1-6

Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising in you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples. Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. The nations come to your light and kings to your dawning brightness. Lift up your eyes and look round: all are assembling and coming towards you, your sons from far away and you daughters being tenderly carried. At this sight you will grow radiant, you heart throbbing and full; since the riches of the sea will flow to you; the wealth of the nations come to you; camels in throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense and singing the praise of the Lord.

Second Reading Ep 3:2-3.5-6

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been revealed through the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets was unknown to any men in past generations; it means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body, and that the same promise has been made to them, in Christ Jesus, through the gospel.

Gospel Mt 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet wrote: And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.
