

JESUS' (AND OUR) TESTING IN THE DESERT

Every year, on this First Sunday of Lent, we enter the desert with Jesus. But the desert places of our lives do not need to be restricted to places of physical aridity. Struggles with relationships, both personal and work-related, can test us at various times throughout our lives. Every time we meet that interpersonal 'speed hump' in life, or grapple with a particular moral dilemma, we have entered the desert with Jesus.

The author of Mark's Gospel, this week, tells us that "the Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days." Whether it was forty consecutive days is not the point. The author of the Gospel uses the term, as many of the authors throughout the Bible do, to denote a very long time, even to designate a lifetime.

Jesus had to struggle throughout his life to heed His Father's mission. That mission was to be the personification of God's Reign, of God's all-pervading presence, throughout the world, and beyond. The offer God puts before us is no more and no less than the life we call eternal.

Jesus' mission is now our mission. Despite our arid times. Despite the setbacks that we face, personally, and as the community of the disciples of Jesus, we are called, through the Sacrament of Baptism to show God's love in the world, now! We do this in and through the Church. Together, we gather, we are fed by the Lord's Word, shared in Sacred Scripture; we are fed at the altar with Our Lord's Body and Blood in Holy Communion. Then we are sent forth, co-missioned to live and share our faith.

May this season of Lent give us the spiritual renewal to continue our journey to the Father, irrespective of our struggles and our times of aridity. Along the way the Holy Spirit will re-create us as beacons of hope, leading all to share in the joy of Christ's Resurrection.

First Reading

Gen 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Second Reading

1 Pt 3:18-22

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

Gospel Reading

Mk 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'
