#### **SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY**

"By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange" (CCC 221).

The whole of human existence as we experience it, flows from the Truth of a God who exists as three divine Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – a Mystery echoed in 1 John 4:7-21: "God is love". John does *not* say, God does loving things, or inspires love in us. But rather, God *IS* love. Every love this world knows, which grounds, excites, and draws the human heart on, comes from the abyss, of the God who *is* love. Yet, for God to be love, logic dictates that there be more than one; anything less egotism. Love always gives, spiraling not inward, but outward. This Mystery we are invited into.

What's the feeling a mother has gazing upon her child? Or the agony and longing felt at the death of a loved one? The feeling of injustice at the sight of a refugee in flight, or a starving child? Don't be fooled, these experiences embedded deep within our nature are an echo of the eternal dwelling within us. They simply experiences of living within the Trinity! In daily joys and sorrows, agony and rejoicing, we find not only proof of the God who is love, but evidence that we live within that love - the One by whom "we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28).

God has not merely shared impersonal facts about himself; but has shared himself, and has invited us into his own inner life and communion of love. Today, the Church proclaims the truth about God, God is love - and with this, God professes the truth about the human person – we are made for love. We belong to the eternal God—we have an eternal home!

Entrance Antiphon: Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his

First Reading Ex 34:4-6: 8-9

With the two tablets of stone in his hands, Moses went up the mountain of Sinai in the early morning as the Lord had commanded him. And the Lord descended in the form of a cloud, and Moses stood with him there. He called on the name of the Lord. The Lord passed before him and proclaimed, 'Lord, Lord, a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.' And Moses bowed down to the ground at once and worshipped. 'If I have indeed won your favour, Lord,' he said, 'let my Lord come with us, I beg. True, they are a headstrong people, but forgive us our faults and our sins, and adopt us as your heritage.'

Gospel Jn 3:16-18

Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son'.
