Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, and while the truth of this solemnity has always been held in the hearts of the faithful, the feast itself is a relatively newer one in Church history. Established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, the feast emerged for a very necessary and striking reason. This period in history had witnessed particularly turbulent and worrisome times, dictatorships had abounded in Europe and beyond, while secularisation had also grown. A noisy cocktail of war, division, fear and confusion thus reigned; yet in the midst of this loud cacophony continued the natural human search for identity, security and... an answer.

Jesus had long been referred to throughout the ages as King, however, in the first part of the 20th century the Church and all the faithful saw this knowledge of and reverence for His authority and Kingship waning. The noise of the world and human desires had begun to distract the human heart once again. In response, this feast sought to reaffirm and remind many of the only true, lasting and comforting Kingship. When we look around us today, I'm sure you would agree, that this feast is perhaps needed more now than ever.

Often in the scriptures Jesus evokes us to come away awhile and rest in Him. This past week the Archdiocesan clergy did just that on the annual clergy retreat. One thing that struck me again this past week, was the natural need for silence in a relationship with God, in order to hear Him speak. In the Power of Silence, Cardinal Robert Sarah noted just this, speaking against the 'dictatorship of noise' which takes the human heart away from God. In a world where noise abounds, where technology and materialism continue to distract and viciously claim us for their own, we are reminded of the centrality and strength of silence. Only in silence can the human person truly know God and thus themselves. Only here can they discover their true King. And so with so much noise, moments of true silence only become more necessary.

Cardinal Sarah acknowledges that while "silence is difficult... it makes a human being able to allow themselves to be led by God." In this way, "[it] is more important than any other human work. For it expresses God. The true revolution then comes from silence; it leads us toward God and others so as to place ourselves humbly and generously at their service."

Silence is not then an absence, but quite the contrary, the revelation of a presence, "the most intense of all presences". "The real questions of life are posed in silence. Our blood flows through our veins without making any noise, and we can hear our heartbeat only in silence."

Pope Francis too writes of how "the Lord speaks to us in a variety of ways... at every moment. Yet we simply cannot do without the silence of prolonged prayer, which enables us better to perceive God's language, to interpret the real meaning of the inspirations we believe we have received, to calm our anxieties and to see the whole of our existence afresh in his own light." The Pope concludes: "In this way, we allow the birth of a new synthesis that springs from a life inspired by the Spirit."

As we approach the season of expectant waiting for the Nativity of Jesus (which too occurred in a certain silence), let us consciously avoid 'filling' every space and time with projects, activities and noise, but rather let us not be afraid to create moments and places of silence, both within and outside ourselves. For when we do this, we become aware of God's voice in a way we may have never noticed before; and thus the voices of those around us. In silence we can hear and feel Jesus, as the Lord and King of our Life.

Let us not forget, a king is usually one who stands far off and acts through armies from the safe, glorious heights of his castle... but not our King! He comes and suffers with his people. He enters the mess and scandal of our lives! But most strikingly He reveals Himself in the silence of a manger and the depths of the human heart.

As one Body let us continue to make the journey, together. Know always of your priests' prayers for you. *Fr Trenton*



Readings of the Day – Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe —Year C

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! Blessed is he who inherits the kingdom of David our Father; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Alleluia!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: The Lord sits as King for ever. The Lord will bless his people with peace.

First Reading

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. 'Look' they said 'we are your own flesh and blood. In days past when Saul was our king, it was you who led Israel in all their exploits; and the Lord said to you, "You are the man who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you shall be the leader of Israel." So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a pact with them at Hebron in the presence of the Lord, and they anointed David king of Israel.

Second Reading

We give thanks to the Father who has made it possible for you to join the saints and with them to inherit the light. Because that is what he has done: he has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves, and in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins.

He is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers – all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross.

Gospel Reading

The people stayed there before the cross watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said, 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said, 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied, 'today you will be with me in paradise.'
