### **HOLY WEEK**

Today, Palm Sunday, begins Holy Week and marks Jesus' triumphant entry back into Jerusalem. As Jesus approaches, we hear "[Jesus] came to Bethphage [and Bethany] on the Mount of Olives" (Mtt. 21:1ff). It seems we're getting a few little geographical details. No big deal, right? But for those who know the Holy Land, you know that just east of the city of Jerusalem is the Mount of Olives and east of this are Bethphage and Bethany. Superfluous details? Not in the slightest!

All these places are directly east of Jerusalem, which is significant. The evangelist is drawing deep images from Jewish heritage. Jesus is approaching Jerusalem, from the east. The Prophet Ezekiel had centuries earlier spoken about gazing upon the temple and witnessing something most distressing: "Then I looked, and behold... the Glory of the Lord departed from the threshold of the temple... by the east gate." (Ezk 10:18-19). Jesus now, however, enters from the east - the Glory of God, is re-entering His temple once more and returning the same way he had left; from the East!

In today's readings we hear Jesus' Passion, all within the context of this Palm Sunday celebration and triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The new Temple will now be His Body, given for us, of which we have become a part through baptism.

Chrism Mass – 25th March |5pm|St Christopher's – All welcome! The Chrism Mass celebrates the unity of the Archbishop to his priests and all the baptised as members of Christ's Body. At this Mass, the priests renew their priestly promises, and the Archbishop blesses the oil of Catechumens and of the Sick, as well as consecrating the oil of Chrism, which will all be used in the sacraments throughout the

THE SACRED TRIDUUM - At the heart of the Church's liturgical year lies the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection: the Triduum (meaning three days). The whole history of salvation revolves around these holy days, and through his Church, God invites us to experience this Mystery of Salvation.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper begins the Easter Triduum, which is actually one liturgy spanning three days. At the Last Supper, Jesus washed his disciples' feet, an act of sacrificial love and service. This night, Jesus gave meaning to what He would accomplish the following day on the Cross. This night Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist and the gift of the ministerial priesthood, teaching us in this moment the greatest commandment of all, to love and serve each-other, as he has us.

Good Friday – The Lord's Passion recalls the greatest act of Love, when Jesus dies for our sins that we may rise to new life with Him. We recall His Passion and venerate the Cross: the glorious instrument of our redemption. The Cross, now and always, proclaims Jesus' victory over sin and death. "We adore you O Christ and we Bless You; for by your Holy Cross, you have redeemed the world".

The Easter Vigil - 'the Mother of all Liturgies', in this most Holy Night we experience Jesus' Rising from the dead. We gather in darkness, but that darkness soon gives way to The Light, the Light of the world and with this the greatest hope! As a Church, we sing Alleluia for the first time in forty days. Jesus has now destroyed the greatest enemy of all, death itself.

Please see inside the Bulletin for Liturgy times. May you all know how close Christ is to you in these days, how close He is in His Church, and how much He truly loves you. He enters Jerusalem for love of you, to die for love of you and to claim you back... for Himself.

- Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
- The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the
  beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. In Lent, we omit the "Alleluia" at Mass.

First Reading Isaiah 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Second Reading Philippians 2:6-11

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
