

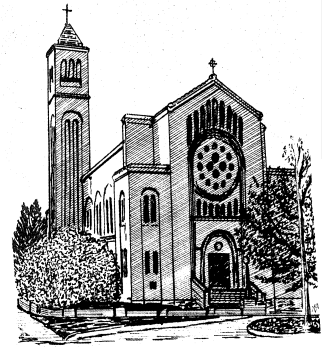

PALM SUNDAY of the LORD'S PASSION

HOLY WEEK

Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, with the triumphant entry of Jesus' back into Jerusalem. The Prophet Ezekiel, had centuries earlier, spoken about gazing upon the temple and witnessing something most distressing: "Then I looked, and behold... the Glory of the Lord departed from the threshold of the temple... by the east gate." (Ezk 10:18-19).

Jesus now, however, enters from the east! And so the Glory of God re-enters His temple, and returns the same way he had left, from the East. We recount Jesus' Passion, all within the context of this Palm Sunday celebration and triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The new Temple will now be His Body, given for us, and of which we have become a part through baptism.

This Week:

The Chrism Mass (Monday 11th April, 5pm) – focuses upon the blessing and consecration of the Oils, the *Oil of Catechumens*, the *Oil of the Sick*, and the *Sacred Oil of Chrism*, which will be used in the sacraments throughout the year. This Mass also manifests the unity of the Archbishop to his priests and all the baptised as members of Christ's Body. At this Mass the priests renew their priestly promises of service and sacrifice. All are most welcome.

THE HOLY TRIDUUM

At the heart of the Christian life is the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' *Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection*: called the *Triduum*, meaning three days. The whole history of salvation revolves around these days, and through the Church, God invites us to experience this Mystery.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper – begins the Easter Triduum, which is actually one liturgy spanning three days. At the Last Supper, Jesus washed his disciples' feet, an act of self-giving love and service, offering meaning to what he would accomplish the following day on the Cross. This night Jesus gives Himself in the Eucharist and so too the priesthood, teaching us here, the greatest commandment of all, to love each other as He has loved us.

Good Friday – *The Way of the Cross (10am, SPC)*. The Lord's Passion recalls the greatest act of Love when Jesus dies for our sins, that we may rise to new life in Him. We recall his Passion and venerate the Cross: the glorious instrument of our redemption (**3pm SCC**). The Cross, now and always, proclaims Jesus' victory over sin and death. "We adore you O Christ and we Bless You; for by your Holy Cross, you have redeemed the world".

The Easter Vigil – 'the Mother of all Liturgies' is the Holy Night in which we experience, after the silence of Holy Saturday, Jesus' Rising from the dead. We gather in darkness, but that darkness soon gives way to the Light, the Light of the world and with this the greatest hope! As a Church, we sing *Alleluia* for the first time in forty days. Jesus has now destroyed the greatest enemy of all, death itself!

Friends, may we all know how close Jesus is to a broken humanity in these days, how close he is in His Church, and how much he truly loves you. Jesus enters Jerusalem for love of you, to die for love of you and to claim you back... for Himself.

Let us courageously enter into the events of this week, holding in prayer all those to truly suffer around the world in our human family. Let us become particularly tender to those around us in these days, for it is in the tenderness of the God who come to die for us, that we find the lasting, true joy of the Resurrection.

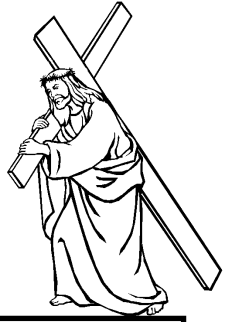

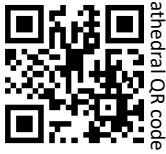

First Reading

Is 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Second Reading

Phil 2:6-11

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
