Dear Parishioners of St Christopher's Cathedral Parish

Pentecost: The Descent of the Holy Spirit

With great joy we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost– 50 days after the Resurrection, it marks the last day of the Easter Season. Jesus has risen into heaven (the Ascension) and now the Father and the Son send us the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate just as Jesus had promised! And yet what's striking is the fact that Pentecost begins in the last place we would expect! The disciples are huddled in the upper room, with doors locked...why? For *fear*! Fear and uncertainty have seized them – paralysed after all that has happened, they're trapped. These days of isolation have allowed us, in a certain way, to experience a feeling similar to those disciples following that *first* Easter experience. What's next? Where does this leaves us? And perhaps the deeper question within...Where is *He* in this?!

In this moment however everything changes, forever. A certain joy that was absent is now restored. Confidence returns, as God breaths His life into His Church! For after all, a body without breath is dead

The Lord now walks through the locked door! Certainly no barrier. And the first words He speaks are words of *peace*; words spoken no less to you and I this day amid the fear and uncertainty of corona virus and our own personal burdens. And immediately after his greeting, Jesus draws attention not to His glory but to His *wounds*. Any reflection on Jesus' wounds is a reflection on the wounds of you and I. Jesus does not appear without them, but with wounds transformed, our wounds. This is significant. The knowledge that we are wounded sets us free. It sets us free from becoming self-referential and reminds us of our life and dependence in Christ. In Jesus our wounds are transformed and our weaknesses becomes the place of joy, because it is the place where Jesus is found.

It is the Holy Spirit breathed into each of us, the Church, this day that makes such a life possible! Jesus breathes and at that moment the doors burst open and all fear that once seized the disciples is dispelled. They are no longer trapped and nor are we! This image recalls God's breathing over the waters in the beginning and more significantly His breathing into the corpse of Adam in the creation story. And now God breathes life into His beloved Church and gives Her birth. It is no longer a corpse, but a living Body, His Body.

And what is the outcome? They go out into the world, witnessing just as Jesus commanded them: "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you" (John 20:21).

These days can be confusing but take courage – it is a good time, because it is a time which images the fertile ground of the early Church. The Holy Spirit is working in His Church as He always has. Our God is so very close, and today He breaths once more the Spirit of Truth and Life, the Spirit of Comfort and Joy into his Body – you and I.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

Today, Pentecost Sunday, we invoke the Holy Spirit to renew the Church and the world. One of the most beautiful prayers in our Liturgy is the **Sequence of Pentecost**, proclaimed before the Gospel. In it we pray that God, the Holy Spirit, would soften our hearts, that we may be truly transformed by His power, to be filled, shaped and moulded by God. Come, Holy Spirit!

Sequence of Pentecost

Holy Spirit, Lord of light, From the clear celestial height Thy pure beaming radiance give. Come, thou Father of the poor, Come with treasures which endure; Come, thou light of all that live! Thou, of all consolers best, Thou, the soul's delightful guest, Dost refreshing peace bestow; Thou in toil art comfort sweet; Pleasant coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. Light immortal, light divine, Visit thou these hearts of thine, And our inmost being fill: If thou take thy grace away, Nothing pure in man will stay; All his good is turned to ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour thy dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. Thou, on us who evermore Thee confess and thee adore, With thy sevenfold gifts descend: Give us comfort when we die; Give us life with thee on high; Give us joys that never end.

Readings of the Day – Pentecost Sunday —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said. alleluia.

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading 1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Gospel Reading Jn 20:19-23

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven: for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

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
