PENTECOST- THE GIFT OF CHARISM

Their lives changed dramatically in those years. Dramatically! And now, the closest followers of Jesus find themselves at a roadblock, a dead end even - or so it seemed. In the Upper room they sit, not knowing what to do next. We learn why they are there too! Fear! A fear which paralysed them.

Yet what's most relatable, is that even were the doors 'unlocked' and the disciple's boldness and courage aplenty - even then, this motley crew still would not have known what to do next, or where to go. Familiar?

If this were the case, and they had 'known', it would mean it was purely a human mission. One driven by limited, earthly vision and ego... And such a vision - as history has shown - is always doomed to crumble and fall – and what a fall it has (Matt 7:27).

It is by the Holy Spirit's Power alone, that they are enabled to move forward. That they can leave their captivity.

'The Advocate' whom Jesus promised. The One who hovered over the waters in the beginning (Gen 1:2); who hovered over the Virgin Mary and by whose power she conceived the Word within her (Lk 1:35). Now that same Spirit breaths into the tomb of the upper room, and those within are not only freed, but emboldened to truly live, and to spread to all peoples the redemptive and freeing love of their Lord and Master.

They received in this moment the Holy Spirit, and were apportioned His grace-filled gifts. The Church is born through this breath, and is sustained and rehabilitated daily by that same Spirit. Indeed, without the Holy Spirit the church would not be the living Body of Jesus, but a corpse, only left to atrophy, corruption and decay.

Pentecost however, marks God's promise coming to fruition in the lives of his children, the baptised. No longer loving from a distance, God the Father has sent his Son to take up all people into His Son's Living Body; and now not abandoning but with the Son, forever breathing the Spirit of Life, Strength and Truth into that Body.

God continues His Saving Mission in His Body, today - in the Baptised here and now - with the Holy Spirit.

When the Christian prays they are reminded that this Holy Breath, bestows all the baptised with a multitude of gifts for service of the Body. These gifts are also called *charisms*, promising a new birth of the Church in every moment.

Saint Paul writes, "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work."

On Pentecost Sunday, in our own Archdiocesan Year of Walking Together, we are prompted once more to remember that the Holy Spirit is continually being breathed into the Church, daily. This lifegiving spiration makes the Church, and so the baptised who are called into the divine mystery. We all have a role to play in building up Jesus' Body.

(The Holy Spirit Who sanctifies the people of God through ministry and the sacraments gives the faithful special gifts also (cf. 1 Cor. 12:7), "allotting them to everyone according as He wills" (1 Cor. 12:11) in order that individuals, administering grace to others just as they have received it, may also be "good stewards of the manifold grace of God" (1 Peter 4:10), to build up the whole body in charity (cf. Eph. 4:16). From the acceptance of these charisms, including those which are more elementary, there arise for each believer the right and duty to use them in the Church and in the world for the good of men and the building up of the Church, in the freedom of the Holy Spirit who "breathes where He wills" (John 3:8). (Paul, VI, Apostolicam Actuositatem, 1965).

May Pentecost 2023 bring renewed excitement and hope, fulfilling horizons in every human heart and emboldening all the baptised to discern our Spirit-given Charism, for the service of the whole Body, the Church.

First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading

1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13 No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Gospel

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you'. After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven: for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'
