Dear parishioners and visitors,

All living things have a birthday, and the Church, as a living organism, has Pentecost as Hers. With great joy then, we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost; fifty days after the Resurrection, it marks the last day of the Easter Season. Jesus has ascended into heaven and now the Father and the Son send us the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, the Breath of God, just as Jesus had promised!

We know how important breath is. If we human beings do not breathe, we die... so it is a matter of life and death! Yet how often do we take this most essential action for granted? We just breathe on, whether awake or asleep, and so too life goes on. Yet, occasionally, we become aware of that breathing, especially when we become 'short' of breath! How powerful it is to stop and pause, to pause and focus on something which we so often take for granted - something which really is a matter of life and death.

At Pentecost - this incredible moment in our human history - it is breath that we focus upon. Yet it is not our breath, but God's! The God who breathes, a breath that is life. How often do we think of that? In the beginning, when darkness covered the earth, with only the chaos to reign, the first sound to pierce through is the sound of God breathing. The breath of God moves across the waters and the chaos is no more... what was nothing, by God's breath becomes... something!

As God walks in the Garden of Paradise, he reaches down, moulds the earth, and breathes into it. And what do we hear? God breaths into life the human person. And it is not only in Genesis. As the Son, who loved his Father to the end, lays in the tomb, the breath of God once more shudders the world and now even death itself. Jesus is raised from the dead. Jesus, once lying in the tomb, a corpse, wounded, contorted and bruised, now with the breath of God, is raised. God breathes the Holy Spirit into the flesh which is ours, and the fullness of life ensues. A life that can never be destroyed. In the story of Pentecost, what God did in the beginning to create us, he now does to create the Church, capable of living well beyond fear and death.

In the Gospel, we hear how the disciples are huddled behind locked doors. Yet once the breath of God floods forth, the doors burst open, fear is cast away, and they are no longer 'trapped'. But now, filled with the courage and life of God, they are sent out. The corpse has become a living body, which has conquered even death itself. Friends, this is you and I, this is the Church. God is with us! Why? Because God is in us! And now, we, like those up and down the ages, beginning from that first upper room, go out not into the streets of Jerusalem but the streets of the world.

The Breath of the Holy Spirit reveals to us two things. The first, that it is God's Church, not ours. God's Body, imbued with God's Breath... and therefore, God's problem. And because of this, there is no scandal, no wound, no attack that can ever destroy this Body which is enlivened not by human breath, human hands, human ideologies... but the living breath of God: The Holy Spirit! The second truth reveals that we are a living Church, a living body, which grows and thrives! We are a Church which is breathing. And so, in these days of great trial, of pandemic and suffering, we turn to the Church, the truth of who we are. And confident of that identity we move forward with joyful confidence and certainty, in a world which can so often be uncertain.

So on this day let us pray with great joy, especially as we prepare for October and the first session of the Plenary Council: Come Holy Spirit; Veni Sancte Spiritus. Come into the Church in Australia and the world, in new and deeper ways, so that just as the Church was born in the beginning by the power of the Spirit, so too there will be for us in this time a new birth, a new Pentecost.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

Readings of the Day – Pentecost Sunday —Year B



Entrance Antiphon: The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

Responsorial Psalm: Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke of the marvels of God, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

Gal 5:16-25

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

Gospel Reading

Jn 15:26-27; 16:12-15 Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness. And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset. I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'
