SOLEMNITY of MARY, the HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

Friends, we can all feel a tad exhausted as 2022 closes and 2023 greets us... ready or not! And yet, ours is a tiredness which is more than the normal at the beginning of a new year.

It has been a trying time for countless reasons over these last few years. Reasons: global, communal and personal. Many have been blindsided by an anxious and unpredictable period of history, we didn't see coming. Pandemic and war are just two trials which have always appeared in human history, yet have emerged again, to reminded us of the precious and fragile nature of human life.

The end of year brings time to slow down and catch our breath. A time to reset and prepare for the year ahead. And yet too, with the feast of Christmas, a reminder that amid all the fatigue and bruises we may experience: we are not on our own.

There is a painting by Garibaldi Melchers depicting the humanity into which God is born. It shows the fatigue and perseverance of the holy family. It is a *human* depiction of this Mystery; and so an accurate depiction. What a tragedy to over romanticise the Miracle of the Incarnation.

Mary lay exhausted, as Joseph watches over the newborn Jesus; the weight of the world on his shoulders, and etched upon his face. Yet now the Creator of all, the Word made Flesh lay with them. And still the questions of life remain as present as ever. What's next? What does this mean? Where do we now go?

We often make the unhelpful mistake of assuming the Holy Family was distant from our own experience. Yet Melchers' painting tells a more accurate story. They are weary, tired, with a great task still ahead of them... and yet, into this, the Child is born. God shys not away from a broken, wounded, exhausted humanity. Rather... He joins it.

At years end, when many are overcome with fatigue, Mary, the Mother of God - teaches us how to live through the Christ who is born to us. To share in the experience of being human. Mary and Joseph remain close to each other, and in their humanity we see the power of hope, pushing us beyond fatigue. And the reason for their hope? Their reason to believe that they will actually make it through this? The Reason now lay in their hands, their hearts, and the feeding trough before them. Emmanuel, God-with-us.

Today we begin the New Year with the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. No coincidence! This is where it begins. Where the God who Created, now comes close to the creatures He loves and honours, through the womb of an exhausted human mother.

We pray our society honour the dignity and vocation of motherhood and the family. Not degrading, discouraging or annoyingly trying to redefine – but recognising it as the foundation it is - the greatest vocation, revelation and gift of God's love, the world could know.

In Melchers image, we learn a valuable lesson - God never loves from a distance. Which means, we should never have to search for Him. He is in our midst, subtle and human. He meets you in the fatigue of the here and now.

The Christmas mystery is of the God who chose to place Himself, tiny and helplessly dependent, into the protective womb, loving arms and gentle hands of a human mother. From Mary, God takes human flesh, all because of her faith-filled yes. Is there any greater vocation? Thank God for the gift of motherhood, truly a witness and participation in God's creative, nurturing love.

JESUS - and Jesus alone - is the joy, hope and promise which allows the human heart to see beyond the seemingly insurmountable fatigue of the present, whatever it may be.

This is the *truth of Christmas* – and the only thing that really matters (and lasts), in a world which surely does test us all at times. May you know, on this Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, that your God is with you - that your God loves you, where you are; fatigued and exhausted. Wishing you a Happy, Holy and Hope-filled 2023.



First Reading

Nm 6: 22-27

Gal 4:4-7

The Lord spoke to Moses and said, 'Say this to Aaron and his sons: "This is how you are to bless the sons of Israel. You shall say to them: May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord let his face shine on you and be gracious to you. May the Lord uncover his face to you and bring you peace." This is how they are to call down my name on the sons of Israel, and I will bless them.'

Second Reading

When the appointed time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born a subject of the Law, to redeem the subjects of the Law and to enable us to be adopted as sons. The proof that you are sons is that God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts: the Spirit that cries, 'Abba, Father', and it is this that makes you a son, you are not a slave any more; and if God has made you son, then he has made you heir.

Gospel

The shepherds hurried away to Bethlehem and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. When they saw the child they repeated what they had been told about him, and everyone who heard it was astonished at what the shepherds had to say. As for Mary, she treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart. And the shepherds went back glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen; it was exactly as they had been told. When the eighth day came and the child was to be circumcised, they gave him the name Jesus, the name the angel had given him before his conception.
