

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

The extraordinary moment of the Transfiguration, was witnessed by three of Jesus' closest followers, revealing the truth of Who Jesus is, in a way the disciples had never seen before.

"Jesus took with Him Peter, James, and John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There He was transfigured before them. His clothes became radiantly white, brighter than any launderer on earth could bleach them" (Mark 9:2-3)

It is a moment which comes at a crucial time in the journey of the disciples, as Jesus prepares them, and approaches his Passion. Indeed, it could be said, that it comes at a crucial time in our own journey too.

Jesus takes his disciples up the mountain and unveils his Divinity. Yet this dimension of His real identity, while ever present, is only briefly, 'visually' apparent to those around him. Jesus, momentarily, reveals his divine, eternal Glory (John 1:1-5), dwelling perfectly in his humanity, and in doing so reminds those with him of how close God is; of how close the divine really is-especially when it seems he is most distant.

Jesus in this moment however is also instructing his disciples. In this relationship alone, He is saying, not only will they endure the trials to come, but they will be able to make sense of all that lay ahead. Jesus reveals to, and reminds them (and us), to 'take courage!' For the divine now dwells in the midst of the human. As if to comfortingly utter once more: I AM (and will always) be with

In these days, still, Jesus never tires of reminding those he loves and calls, that things are never as they seem. When all appears to be lost, when the "chips are down", when God's presence seems more wishful-thinking and more distant than ever.... Christ whispers a warning... "do not be fooled. I am closer and more united to and aware of all that is going on, than you might first think".

Christ's Transfiguration strengthens the apostles' faith in anticipation of his Passion. That, while there is suffering, while there is pain, while there is doubt... I am there. Indeed, the ascent onto the 'high mountain' prepares for the ascent to Calvary.

This feast is the great reminded to us of Who our God is, the One true God, who never loves from a distance. Every Mass, this same Transfiguration takes place. God reveals his Presence in the world. At the elevation of the Host, we glance upon the Divinity dwelling in what appears merely human, and almost familiar - we are consumed, we are fortified - and for that brief period, all can make sense again, before we too are instructed as the disciples were, to "Go back down the mountain".

We are not alone, and the Eternal Word echoes, not as he did in Exodus, saying, 'I give the bread of life', but now "I AM the Bread of Life" present in your midst – and the one who comes to me will never be hungry, the one who believes in me, will never thirst!

The Transfiguration of the Lord —Year A — 5/6 August



Entrance Antiphon: In a resplendent cloud the Holy Spirit appeared. The Father's voice was heard: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to him

Responsorial: The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! This is my Son, my beloved, in whom is all my delight: listen to him Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: When Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.

First Reading Dn 7:9-10. 13-14

As I watched: Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames, its wheels were a burning fire/ a stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. A court was held and the books were opened. I gaze into the visions of the night. and I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroyed.

Second Reading 2 Pt 1:16-1

It was not any cleverly invented myths that we were repeating when we brought you the knowledge of the power and the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ; we had seen his majesty for ourselves. He was honoured and glorified by God the Father, when the Sublime Glory itself spoke to him and said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour.' We heard this ourselves, spoken from heaven, when we were with him on the holy mountain. So we have confirmation of what was said in prophecies; and you will be right to depend on prophecy and take it as a lamp for lighting a way through the dark until the dawn comes and the morning star rises in your minds.

Gospel Mt 17:1-9

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
