

Dear parishioners and visitors,

*"Out of Compassion for us He descended from Heaven and although He Ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in Him by grace."* – St Augustine.

A blessed Feast of the Ascension! How comforting these words of Saint Augustine for the Christian. Forty days after his Resurrection, Jesus ascends before his beloved disciples, back to his Father. In this moment, triumphant humanity enters divine glory, and now sits at the right hand of the Father. Jesus' earlier words to Mary Magdalene resound here: "...go to my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." In these words are again found the great promise: Jesus has made us God's children. Jesus, the head of the Body, precedes us this day into the Father's glorious kingdom so that "where the head has gone before in Glory, the body is called to follow in Hope" (from the Collect prayer for the Ascension).

We await now the Holy Spirit, the Comforter through whom Jesus fulfils those last words of Mathew's Gospel, words spoken no less to you and I than to the disciples in that precious moment: "know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time" (Matt 28:20).

Today, we name and celebrate the truth, that our true homeland is in heaven – to echo the words of St Paul. The Truth that we see with the open eye is that this Earth, however much we are creatures of it, is not our true home nor our end! Do we live in this knowledge day to day? After the Ascension, the disciples are told to "stay in the city, until... clothed with power from on high." We too, for the next week, shall wait for the promise of the Holy Spirit because we are not called, nor made, to stay in the city forever. But with the breath of the Spirit within us, we are commissioned "to go out to the whole world, and proclaim the Good News!"

We also begin this Ascension Sunday, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which continues until Pentecost Sunday. This week of prayer focuses all those who bear the name of Christian around John 15:1-7: "Abide in my love and you will bear much fruit." We pray in these days for the genuine unity of all Christians, that we may strengthen our witness together of the God who is life, and who dwells among us. With the difference of 'the stranger', we can often risk withdrawing into ourselves and seeing only that which separates us. But let us listen this week especially to the way Christ invites us to abide in his love, and so to bear much fruit.

While in Canberra, and indeed Australia, we are fortunate, we still see so many affected by COVID-19 around our world. As we begin our week of prayer, we remember all to whom we are united in Jesus' One Body, and the many millions of people who have suffered and died from this pandemic. We remember too those innocent, suffering unimaginably in the Gaza strip. Over these last weeks Jesus' voice has echoed the desire that we might come to and abide in him and his love, especially in the midst of suffering. Jesus invites us tirelessly, hopeful that united to him, we will find comfort (and even meaning) in our suffering, and in perseverance produce fruit that will bring life to all.

Finally, friends, this week the clergy of the Archdiocese, with Archbishop Christopher, will have their annual Clergy Assembly. Please keep us in your thoughts and prayers during our time together, as we will you.

## Readings of the Day – The Ascension of the Lord —Year B

**Entrance Antiphon:** *Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.*

**Responsorial Psalm:** *God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.*

**Gospel Acclamation:** *Alleluia, alleluia! Go and teach all people my gospel. I am with you always, until the end of the world. Alleluia!*

**Communion Antiphon:** *Behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age, alleluia.*

### First Reading

**Acts 1:1-11**

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

### Second Reading

**Eph 1:17-23**

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

### Gospel Reading

**Mk 16:15-20**

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.' And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.
