Dear Parishioners and Visitors to Saint Christopher's Cathedral Parish, On the 27th of February 1928 the Parish of Saint Christopher's was established, with Father Patrick Haydon the first parish priest. It wasn't until 1938 however that Saint Christopher's church was built and the following year officially opened. *Canberra*, which means 'meeting place' was so named because as the growing Capital, it was somewhere that many travellers would come, and so dedicating the Church and parish under the patronage of Saint Christopher the patron saint of travellers, seemed a fitting and obvious choice.

On the 5th of February 1948 the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn was formally established. The Church then was later extended and, on the Silver Jubilee of the Archdiocese, the 5th of February 1973 Archbishop Thomas Cahill, consecrated the extensions and St Christopher's became the Cathedral of the Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn. On this day the Archbishop anointed the walls where the candles now stand - and on the anniversary date each year, burn brightly - setting this building aside as holy, where the *living stones* who gathering within, come to worship and give glory to God (1 Peter 2:4-6). On Tuesday we celebrate the 47th anniversary of the Cathedral's dedication.

We celebrate the anniversary of the dedication of a church because it is the physical representation of the community of faith which regularly gathers within; it is too the place where the Sacred Mysteries of our faith take place. Observing the dedication celebrates the mystery of the living Church, that is, the people of God in pilgrimage to the new Jerusalem.

St Christopher's is also however the Eucharistic heart and the sign of unity of our Local Church of Canberra and Goulburn. The word "Cathedral" has origins in the Greek "kathedra," meaning "chair." This 'chair' seen in the sanctuary of each Cathedral is that of the bishop, who from this place, as a true shepherd, lovingly guides the life of the Local Church entrusted to him by Christ, known as a diocese.

On Tuesday, Archbishop Christopher (in Saint Christopher's!) will celebrate midday Mass for this solemnity. That evening communal vespers (evening prayer) will be prayed in the Sacred Heart Chapel with Adoration beginning at 5pm. All are most welcome to join us on this joyous occasion.

We pray for all those who have gathered over many years to worship within the walls of this parish Church and Cathedral, in moments of great sorrow and fear as well as those of immense joy and awe.

May every pilgrim who visits this place, go forth having experienced the gentle presence and the merciful Heart of the God who walks among us.

And may we continue to invoke the intercession and protection of Saint Christopher as we continue along the pilgrim way.

Readings of the Day – The Presentation of the Lord —Year A

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord!

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! This is the light of revelation to the nations, and the glory of your people Israel.

Alleluia!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: My eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples.

First Reading Mal 3:1-4

The Lord God says this: Look, I am going to send my messenger to prepare a way before me. And the Lord you are seeking will suddenly enter his temple; and the angel of the covenant whom you are longing for, yes, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. Who will be able to resist the day of his coming? Who will remain standing when he appears? For he is like the refiner's fire and the fuller's alkali. He will take his seat as refiner and purifier; he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and then they will make the offering to the Lord as it should be made. The offering of Judah and Jerusalem will then be welcomed by the Lord as in former days, as in the years of old.

Second Reading Heb 2:14-18

Since all the children share the same blood and flesh, Jesus too shared equally in it, so that by his death he could take away all the power of the devil, who had power over death, and set free all those who had been held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. For it was not the angels that he took to himself; he took to himself descent from Abraham. It was essential that he should in this way become completely like his brothers so that he could be a compassionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion, able to atone for human sins. That is, because he has himself been through temptation he is able to help others who are tempted.

Gospel Reading Lk 2:22-40

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord – observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord – and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons. Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God, and he said:

'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.'

As the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected – and a sword will pierce your own soul too – so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare.'

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem.

When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.
