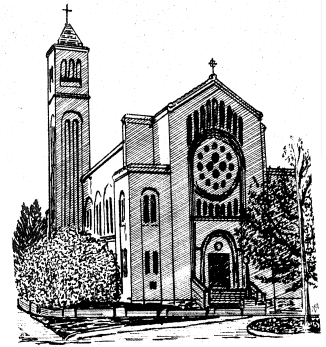

TRINITY SUNDAY

On Christmas we celebrate God being with us,

At Easter we celebrate God being for us,

At Pentecost we celebrate God being in us.

Today on Trinity Sunday, we celebrate God being God.

It never ceases to amaze me, how much God has shared with us about Himself; this is perhaps the greatest most wonderful mystery of our faith. God does not have an obligation to share anything with us, nor do we have a need to know it. Nevertheless, God does it any way. For no other reason than his love for us, God shares with us who He is.

We saw God first in mystery, he appeared to the patriarchs through signs and in disguises. He revealed himself to Moses in the burning bush by the name I AM WHO (I) AM, and then showed Moses his face upon Mount Sinai. The prophets saw visions of his glory. But now, we Christians see God in the flesh, in the person of Jesus Christ, in the Holy Eucharist. We have seen God in His fullness. He has held nothing back from us.

God revealed himself to us fully through Jesus. It is true that the term "Trinity" is not found in the Bible but the meaning of the Trinity is plainly seen in Scripture. Jesus gives us the great commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." *Matthew 28:19*. At His own baptism we hear the voice of the Father calling Jesus His Son, and we see the Spirit. Jesus speaks openly about His Spirit, and the Spirit of God, He calls God His Father. The Apostles bless their readers using a Trinitarian formula: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

The doctrine of the Trinity is the most controversial teaching of Christianity, but it is also the most crucial. If we do not understand who God is, then we completely miss the point of our faith!

The Trinity, three persons consubstantial in one divine union shows us that "God is love". *1 John 4:8*. For in the Trinity there is no domination, nor squabbling, no division but only distinction and the outpouring of creative love.

Theologians use the term *Perichoresis* or *Circumincession* to describe THE relationship of the Trinity, it is a triple indwelling: the Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father, the Holy Spirit is the Love that is shared, and as it is shared it is also loved. The Father loves the love of the Son, the Son loves the love of the Father, the love itself, the Holy Spirit, loves their love. God is perfect love.

Brothers and Sisters, "We are called to be perfect as our Father is perfect" *Matthew 5:8*, let us pray that we might love each other with the love of God. This love created us, our souls were born from it, this love became one of us, this love forgave us, and is now poured out upon us. Let us never waste this love!

First Reading

Prv 8:22-31

The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries – and the waters will not invade the shore – when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.

Second Reading

Rom 5:1-5

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.

Jn 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'
