REFLECTION: The Feast of the Holy Trinity is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate. Speaking on Trinity Sunday, Pope Francis said that celebrating the Trinity is "not so much a theological exercise, but a revolution in our way of life. God, in whom each person lives for the other in a continual relationship, in continual rapport, not for themselves, provokes us to live with others and for others." Some images of the Trinity see the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit sitting together, sometimes at a table. The genius of such an image is that there is room for us at the table. Today's feast is an invitation to contemplate having a seat at the table ... being refreshed and renewed, and hearing a call to mission. As you sit at the table with the Trinity, listen to their conversation as they look at our world. What do you want to say? What do you sense is being asked of you?
