Acknowledgement of Country - We Acknowledge the Ngunnawal people, as Traditional Owners of the land where we gather today and pay our respects to Elders past, present and emerging.

REFLECTION: Have you ever been caught in a storm or saturated by rain? Have you ever been engulfed in morning fog that restricted visibility? A feature of today's Gospel reading is water and weather. We read that Jesus instructs the disciples to cross the lake and then falls asleep to be woken with panic and cries for help. The disciples become frightened and frozen in fear by the gales and the waves. However, Jesus encourages an increase in patience and trust in his presence—later rebuking the conditions and creating a peace. When have you experienced 'storms' that seemed to overwhelm? How do you rediscover calm? Jesus teaches us today that to weather 'storms', a deep trust in his presence is vital and life-saving. (From Gods Word, Daily Reflections 2024)

CHURCH POSITION ON ACT VAD LAWS

STATEMENT OF ARCHBISHOP CHRISTOPHER PROWSE CATHOLIC ARCHBISHOP OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CANBERRA AND GOULBURN REGARDING A.C.T. LEGISLATION ON EUTHANASIA (VAD)

The legislation at present in the A.C.T. Assembly is based on a MISTAKEN COMPASSION. Compassion/love never kills but stays alongside the terminally ill sufferer. By closeness and tenderness, we accompany those who struggle with their finiteness and care for them.

The ascendancy of narratives based on euthanasia generate despair and a complete lack of genuine hope and accompaniment of our beloved dying.

Genuine Palliative care is the best and most compassionate response to the dying. It is to be uppermost in our considerations. It is to be better resourced and widely available, especially for those in rural areas.

More recent discussions on extending Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD), through the use of Power of Attorney, is a most troubling development. It crosses the line of legislation aimed at the terminally ill and is unambiguously aimed, as a form of State sanctioned suicide, at those who are not terminally ill.
