Fourth Sunday of Advent | Year C | 22 December 2024

In the recounting of the visitation of Elizabeth by Mary, both John (who is still within Elizabeth's womb) and Elizabeth herself greet the Blessed Virgin Mary, who is then in the early stages of pregnancy with Jesus. Both respond with exultant joy to her arrival. And Elizabeth declares Mary to be blessed, because she 'believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled'. In identifying this belief as Mary's source of blessing, a great truth is revealed to us. Faith does not consist merely in accepting a set of propositions contained in the creed or the catechism. Rather it is the embracing of a mystery which is beyond us with trust and love, and yearning hopefully for the fulfilment of a promise which surpasses all our desires and imaginings.

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the

sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ
