	VIOLET (PURPLE) Meaning: Penance, preparation Seasons: Advent, Lent Symbols: Advent wreath, candles, ashes, cross
	WHITE / GOLD Meaning: Joy, purity, glory Seasons: Christmas, Easter, Solemnities Symbols: Nativity, star, Paschal candle, empty tomb
	RED Meaning: Holy Spirit, new life Days: Ordinary Time Symbol: Fire, dove, palms, cross
	ROSE Meaning: Joy in the midst of penance Days: Gaudete Sunday (Advent), Laetare Sunday (Lent) Symbol: Rose-colored vestments
	BLACK (OPTIONAL) Symbol: Mourning, remembrance Days: Funerals, All Souls' Day
