I was blind, now I see



One day, Jesus and his disciples saw a man who had been blind since he was born. The disciples wondered why the man was blind. They asked Jesus if the man had done something wrong or if his parents had. Jesus told them that man wasn't blind because of something he did wrong.

Jesus used meeting the blind man to show the people God's love and power. Jesus spat on the ground, made some mud, and gently put it on the man's eyes. Then Jesus told him to go and wash in a special pool. The man went, washed his eyes, and he could see for the first time in his life.

The people who knew the man were amazed. Some couldn't believe it was really him. The religious leaders asked many questions about what had happened.
